### **Normative Activities of WIPO**

### **Consultative Meeting on Trademarks and Internet Domain Names**

Second Session (Geneva, September 1 and 2, 1997)

The following 43 States members of WIPO and/ or the Paris Union were represented at the session: Andorra, Argentina, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, China, Costa Rica, Denmark, Ecuador, Egypt, Eritrea, France, Georgia, Germany, Guatemala, Hungary, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Mexico, Morocco, Netherlands, Nigeria, Norway, Panama, Philippines, Portugal, Republic of Korea, Romania, Rus-Federation. Slovenia. Spain. Switzerland, Thailand, The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, United Kingdom, United States of America, Venezuela. Representatives of the Benelux Trademark Office (BBM), the European Commission, the International Telecommuni-(ITU), Organisation Union the cation Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) and the World Trade Organization (WTO) took part in the session, as well as representatives of 33 non-governmental organizations and three individual participants.

The Meeting continued discussion of a number of issues developed in the first session, which was held in Geneva from May 26 to 30, 1997, including, in particular, possible issues to be considered in the context of harmonization of national and regional laws concerning trademarks and Internet domain names, and comments and suggestions concerning the proposed WIPO Rules for Administrative Challenge Panel Procedure Concerning Internet Domain Names (WIPO ACP Rules) and the draft Substantive Guidelines Concerning Administrative Challenge Panels. These comments and suggestions, and any additional ones received by the International Bureau shortly after the Meeting, will be taken into account in finalizing the ACP Rules and in the processes that will lead to the finalization of the draft Substantive Guidelines.

### Committee of Experts on a Protocol Concerning Audiovisual Performances

First Session (Geneva, September 15, 16 and 19, 1997)

Experts of the following 91 States and one intergovernmental organization, members of the Committee, attended the meeting: Algeria, Angola, Argentina, Armenia, Australia, Austria, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Belgium, Bolivia, Brazil, Brunei Darussalam, Bulgaria, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Canada, Chile, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, Côte d'Ivoire, Croatia, Cuba, Czech Republic, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Denmark, Ecuador, Egypt, Eritrea, Estonia, Finland, France, Gambia, Germany, Ghana, Greece, Guatemala, Honduras, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Ireland, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Lesotho, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malawi, Malaysia, Malta, Mexico, Mongolia, Morocco, Netherlands, Nigeria, Norway, Pakistan, Panama, Peru, Philippines, Portugal, Republic of Korea, Republic of Moldova, Romania, Russian Federation, Senegal, Singapore, Slovakia, South Africa, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Sweden, Switzerland, Tajikistan, Thailand, Togo, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, United States of America, Uruguay, Uzbekistan, Venezuela, Viet Nam, Commission of the European Communities (CEC).

Representatives of the following five intergovernmental organizations attended the meeting in an observer capacity: International Labour Organization (ILO), ITU, Agency for Cultural and Technical Cooperation (AGECOP), Organization of African Unity (OAU), WTO.

Representatives of 38 non-governmental organizations also attended the meeting in an observer capacity.

Discussions were based on the memoranda prepared by the International Bureau of WIPO, in accordance with the decision taken by the Governing Bodies of WIPO and the Unions administered by WIPO at the thirtieth series of meetings in Geneva, on March 20 and 21, 1997, entitled: "Existing national and regional legislation concerning audiovisual performances" and "Information received from Member States of WIPO and from the European Community concerning audiovisual performances."

The Committee adopted the following decision:

- "(i) the second session of the Committee should take place in the period of May-June 1998, but not later than during the week starting June 8, 1998; it is recommended that the Governing Bodies of WIPO take a decision about the dates of the second session during their September-October 1997 series of meetings;
- (ii) the International Bureau should invite the Governments of WIPO Member States and the European Community to submit by January 15,

- 1998, proposals, preferably in treaty language, concerning a protocol to the WIPO Performances and Phonograms Treaty on audiovisual performances:
- (iii) the International Bureau should distribute the proposals, together with comparative tables, if appropriate, by the end of February 1998, to those invited to the second session of the Committee who should be the same as those invited to the first session:
- (iv) regional consultation meetings should be organized by WIPO in consultation with the representatives of the regional groups in March-April 1998; it is recommended that the Governing Bodies of WIPO take a decision about the financing of the participation of the representatives of the regional groups, during the September-October 1997 series of meetings of the Governing Bodies."

### **Information Meeting on Intellectual Property in Databases**

(Geneva, September 17 to 19, 1997)

Representatives of the following 10 intergovernmental organizations attended the Meeting in an observer capacity: United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), ILO, International Maritime Organization (IMO), ITU, World Health Organization (WHO), World Meteorological Organization (WMO), AGECOP, Council of Europe (CE), OAU, WTO.

Representatives of 53 non-governmental organizations also attended the Meeting in an observer capacity.

Discussions were based on the memoranda prepared by the International Bureau of WIPO, in accordance with the decision taken by the Governing Bodies of WIPO and the Unions administered by WIPO at the thirtieth series of meetings in Geneva, on March 20 and 21, 1997, entitled: "Existing national and regional legislation concerning intellectual property in databases" and "Information received from Member States of WIPO and from the European Community and its Member States concerning intellectual property in databases."

The Information Meeting adopted the following recommendation:

- "(i) the International Bureau, when it makes available the detailed summary of the discussions in the Information Meeting as a draft annex to the report of the meeting, should add a document summing up, in an analytic table, the questions raised during the Information Meeting;
- (ii) the International Bureau in the circular letter by which it will distribute the draft annex and the document mentioned in item (i), above, should invite WIPO Member States and the European Community, as well as the intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations invited to the Information Meeting, to submit, by the end of April 1998, information concerning the questions included in the above-mentioned document and on any other related questions they may find relevant;

(iii) the International Bureau should make available such information in a concise form, by the end of June 1998, to the Member States of WIPO and the European Community, so as to facilitate consultations on the issues concerning intellectual property in databases at national and regional level, as well as to the organizations mentioned in item (ii), on the understanding that the information received from intergovernmental and nongovernmental organizations will be made available in the languages in which it is submitted:

(iv) the International Bureau should also send, by the end of September 1998, to the Member States of WIPO and the European Community, as well as to the organizations mentioned in item (ii), an analytic document summarizing the information mentioned in item (iii)."

The Chairman stated the understanding of the Information Meeting that it was up to the competent Governing Bodies of WIPO to take a decision about the convocation of any further WIPO meeting on intellectual property on databases at regional and/or international level, as well as about the preparation and financing of such meetings.

### **Committee of Experts on Well-Known Marks**

Third Session (Geneva, October 20 to 23, 1997)<sup>1</sup>

The following 59 States members of WIPO and/or the Paris Union were represented at the session:<sup>2</sup> Armenia, Australia, Austria, Belarus, Belgium, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cameroon, Canada, China, Costa Rica, Denmark, Ecuador, Egypt, Eritrea, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Guatemala, Hungary, Indonesia, Israel, Italy, Japan, Jordan, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Mauritius, Morocco, Netherlands, Norway, Peru, Philippines, Portugal, Republic of Korea, Republic of Moldova, Romania, Russian Federation, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Africa, Spain, Sudan, Switzerland, Thailand, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom, United Republic of Tanzania, United States of America, Uruguay, Venezuela. The European Communities (EC) were also represented. A representative of the African Regional Industrial Property Organization (ARIPO) took part in the session in an observer capacity. Representatives of 17 non-governmental organizations also took part in the session in an observer capacity.

The Committee of Experts considered a revised draft of proposed provisions on well-known marks contained in document WKM/CE/III/2. As regards the conditions of protection of well-known marks, the majority of delegations and representatives of observer organizations supported the proposed approach, i.e., that the registration or use of the well-known mark in the territory in which it is to be protected should not be a prerequisite for protection. Furthermore, it was agreed that, for the purposes of

In respect of the criteria which were proposed for determining whether a mark is well known, it was agreed after some discussions that all surrounding circumstances from which it may be inferred that the mark was well known should be taken into account, and that circumstances which might be relevant in certain cases could include, in particular, those which would be defined in the draft provisions.

The question of the contents of protection was the subject of a long exchange of views. The majority of the delegations which expressed themselves on that point declared that Offices were not equipped to refuse *ex officio* marks which were in conflict with well-known marks.

As regards the good faith or bad faith of the alleged infringer of a well-known mark, the International Bureau suggested that a person who obtained the registration of or used a mark or business identifier which was in conflict with a well-known mark should be deemed to be in bad faith, unless that person showed that, at the time when he applied for the registration or started using the said mark or business identifier, he did not know and had no reason to know that the mark which is to be protected as a well-known mark existed. In support of this suggestion, it was pointed out by the representatives of several observer organizations that in the great majority of cases in which well-known marks were misappropriated the defending party had acted in bad faith, and that it was

determining whether a mark is to be protected as a well-known mark, it may not be required that the mark be well known in any territory other than the territory in which it is to be protected as a well-known mark or that it be well known by the public at large; it will suffice that the mark be well known by the relevant sector of the public in the territory in which it is to be protected as a well-known mark.

important that presumptions in favor of the owners of well-known marks be created. Other participants expressed doubts, including on the principle of providing for a presumption of bad faith. In conclusion of the meeting, it was agreed that at least one further meeting was needed in order to reach agreement on the contents of the draft provisions.

### Permanent Committee on Industrial Property Information (PCIPI)

Sixth Session (Geneva, September 23, 1997)

of America, Uruguay, Viet Nam, Zimbabwe, ARIPO, BBM, European Patent Organisation (EPO). The International Federation of Industrial Property Attorneys (FICPI) and the Patent Documentation Group (PDG) were represented by observers.

The Permanent Committee noted with approval the summary of the reports of the seventeenth to twentieth sessions of the PCIPI Executive Coordination Committee (PCIPI/EXEC). It also noted with approval the draft report of the Director General on the activities of the Permanent Committee between July 1, 1995, and July 4, 1997.

# **Registration Systems Administered by WIPO**

### **Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT)**

# Training and Promotion Meetings for PCT Users

China. In September 1997, Mr. Gao Lulin, Commissioner, Chinese Patent Office, and another government official discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva the possibility of holding an international symposium on the PCT in the 21st century, following the national training seminar on the PCT scheduled to take place in Beijing in April 1998.

Gambia. In September 1997, Mrs. Isatou Combeh Njai, Registrar General, had discussions with WIPO officials in Geneva on certain PCT questions following the recent deposit by the Gambia of its instrument of accession to that Treaty (which will enter into force, with respect to that country, on December 9, 1997).

Guinea-Bissau. In September 1997, Mr. José Antonio Nosoliny, Director of Industrial Property Services, Directorate General of Industry, met with WIPO officials in Geneva to discuss PCT matters following the recent deposit by Guinea-Bissau of its instrument of accession to that Treaty (which will enter into force, with respect to that country, on December 12, 1997).

Indonesia. In September 1997, a government official had discussions with WIPO officials in Gene-

va on several PCT-related issues, including a national seminar on the PCT to be held in Jakarta in October 1997.

Japan. In September 1997, Mr. Hisamitsu Arai, Commissioner, Japanese Patent Office, and another government official discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva various PCT matters, particularly activities for promoting further use of the PCT in Japan. They also visited several computerization areas of the International Bureau.

Kenya. In September 1997, a government official had discussions with WIPO officials in Geneva on PCT matters, in particular possible PCT training for government officials of the Kenya Industrial Property Office.

Malaysia. In September 1997, Dato' Mohammed Noor Abdul Rahi, Secretary General, Ministry of Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs, and Mrs. Hafisah Mustaffa, Director, Intellectual Property Division, had discussions on the PCT with WIPO officials in Geneva and were briefed on the advantages of accession to that Treaty.

Webster University (Geneva). In September 1997, a WIPO official gave a presentation on WIPO and its activities (including, in particular, the PCT

and its advantages) to 25 students of that University preparing for an international business degree.

### **PCT Computerization Activities**

Singapore. In September 1997, Miss Liew Woon Yin, Registrar of Trade Marks and Patents, had discussions with WIPO officials in Geneva on certain technical issues concerning the PCT.

Sweden. In September 1997, Mr. Carl Anders Ifvarsson, Director General, Swedish Patent and Registration Office, discussed PCT matters with WIPO officials in Geneva and was given a presentation of the organization of the PCT Operations Department as well as a subsequent tour of that Department.

United States of America. In September 1997, five officials of the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) visited WIPO for a technical meeting with WIPO officials, which was convened for the USPTO to demonstrate its encryption technology for the transmittal of priority documents.

Also in September 1997, Mr. Bruce A. Lehman, Assistant Secretary of Commerce and Commissioner, USPTO, and two other government officials discussed computerization matters with WIPO officials in Geneva and visited the PCT Operations Department.

### **Madrid Union**

# Training and Promotion Meetings for Users of the Madrid System

Estonia. In September 1997, Mr. Matti Päts, Director General, The Estonian Patent Office, and another government official met with WIPO officials in Geneva to discuss questions concerning industrial property legislative drafting, including revision of the national trademark law in view of Estonia's expected accession to the Madrid Protocol.

Germany. In September 1997, a government official discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva matters related to the Madrid system and possible training of officials of the German Patent Office in administrative procedures under the said system.

Slovakia. In September 1997, two government officials met with WIPO officials in Geneva to discuss questions relating to the implementation of the

Madrid Protocol, which entered into force with respect to Slovakia on September 13, 1997.

Turkey. In September 1997, Mr. Ugür Gürsad Yalçiner, President, Turkish Patent Institute, and another government official met with WIPO officials in Geneva to discuss Turkey's envisaged accession to the Madrid Protocol, as well as further cooperation with WIPO.

### Computerization Activities (Madrid System)

Switzerland. In September 1997, three officials of the Swiss Federal Institute of Intellectual Property visited WIPO to further discuss future electronic data exchanges between the Institute and WIPO in the field of trademarks, within the MECA (Madrid Electronic CommunicAtions) system.

### **WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center**

### **Internet Domain Name Disputes**

In September 1997, a WIPO official and a WIPO consultant from the United States of America attended in New York City a meeting of the newly-formed Council of Registrars (CORE) for the Generic Top Level Domains Memorandum of Understanding (gTLD-MoU) domain name registration system. Discussions at the meeting dealt, among other matters, with WIPO's activities in connection with the new domain name system and the need for a communication channel between WIPO and CORE.

### Other Activities

United States of America. In September 1997, a WIPO official made presentations on the services of the WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center, and on

the new domain name system and WIPO's on-line dispute resolution mechanism, at a conference entitled "Silicon Valley 2000 ADR: Building the Global Infrastructure for Resolving Technology and Business Disputes," organized in San Francisco by a large law firm.

Brazilian Association of Industrial Property (ABPI). In September 1997, a WIPO official made a presentation on the WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center at a Seminar on Intellectual Property organized by the above Association in Porto Alegre (Brazil).

International Association for the Protection of Industrial Property (AIPPI-MIE). In September 1997, a WIPO official made a presentation on WIPO arbitration of intellectual property disputes at an international conference organized in Budapest by the Hungarian Group of AIPPI, which dealt with recent international developments in the fields of patents and trademarks.

# **Activities of WIPO Specially Designed for Developing Countries**

### **Africa**

### **Training Courses, Seminars and Meetings**

WIPO Regional Seminar on the Protection of Performers' Rights in the French-Speaking Countries of Africa (Togo). From September 3 to 5, 1997, WIPO organized that Seminar in Lomé, in cooperation with the Government of Togo and with the participation of the Association of European Performers Organizations (AEPO). The Seminar was attended by nine heads of copyright offices and nine representatives of artists' unions from Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Côte d'Ivoire, Gabon, Guinea, Mali, the Niger and Senegal. In addition, about 180 local participants from government circles, the legal profession as well as the cultural and artistic sectors also attended the Seminar. Papers were presented by three WIPO experts

from Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire and Senegal, seven officials from Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Côte d'Ivoire and Togo, four AEPO speakers from France, the Netherlands and Sweden, and two WIPO officials. The Seminar also dealt with the Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Industrial Property Rights (TRIPS Agreement).

WIPO African Introductory Course on Industrial Property (Swaziland). From September 10 to 19, 1997, WIPO organized that Course in Mbabane in cooperation with the Government of Swaziland. The Course was attended by 13 participants from Ethiopia, the Gambia, Ghana, Kenya, Lesotho, Malawi, Mauritius, Namibia, Nigeria, the United Republic of Tanzania, Zambia, Zimbabwe and ARIPO. Around 10 local participants also attended.

Presentations were made by three WIPO experts from Sweden, ARIPO and the EPO, and three WIPO officials. The Course also dealt with the TRIPS Agreement.

WIPO Subregional Workshop on the Teaching of Intellectual Property Law (Côte d'Ivoire). From September 1 to 3, 1997, WIPO organized that Workshop in Abidjan in cooperation with the Government of Côte d'Ivoire. The Workshop was attended by eight participants from Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Gabon, Madagascar, Mali, the Niger and Senegal. Presentations were made by four WIPO experts from Belgium, Benin, Egypt and Switzerland, and two WIPO officials. The Workshop also dealt with the TRIPS Agreement.

### **Training Courses, Seminars and Meetings**

WIPO Asian Regional Forum on Intellectual Property Rights in the 21st Century (Japan). From September 10 to 12, 1997, WIPO organized that Forum in Tokyo in cooperation with the Japanese Patent Office (JPO). The Forum was attended by 40 participants from Bangladesh, Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, China, Fiji, India, Indonesia, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Laos, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, the Philippines, the Republic of Korea, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Viet Nam. Some 20 local participants from industrial property-related associations in the private sector and affiliated organizations of the JPO also attended. Presentations were made by seven WIPO consultants from Australia, China, India, Malaysia, the Republic of Korea, Slovenia and

the United States of America, three local speakers and a WIPO official. A total of three WIPO officials attended that Forum. As a result of discussions, emphasis was put on major policy issues, information technology, human resource development, industrial property strategy, and involvement of business sector. During the Forum, special focus was put on the role which intellectual property will play in the overall development of Asia and the Pacific countries in the future, the importance of strengthening the capacities of the developing countries in modernizing and upgrading their intellectual property system, the need for improving the intellectual property network information system for private-sector enterprises as well as the importance of integrating intellectual property policy as a part of economic policy reforms. The Forum was financed by funds provided under the Japanese funds-in-trust arrangement. The Forum also dealt with the TRIPS Agreement.

# Assistance with Training, Legislation and Modernization of Administration

Bangladesh. In September 1997, Mr. Abdul Matin, Registrar of Trade Marks, Department of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks, discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation, including the implementation of the WIPO country project for the computerization of the Trade Mark Registry.

Bhutan. In September 1997, a government official discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation in the field of industrial property legislation.

China - Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (SAR). In September 1997, Mr. Stephen Selby, Director, Intellectual Property Department, Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (SAR), discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation.

Democratic People's Republic of Korea. In September 1997, a WIPO expert from Australia undertook a mission to the Trademark and Industrial Design Department of the State Commission of Science and Technology in Pyongyang to ascertain and develop the operation requirements and the computerization plan of the office. The mission was funded under the WIPO country project for the improvement of the trademark and industrial design system of the country.

Also in September 1997, three government officials discussed with the Director General Elect and other WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation in the field of industrial property.

Fiji. In September 1997, a government official discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation, particularly the implementation of the proposed WIPO country project.

Also in September 1997, the International Bureau prepared and sent to the government authorities, at their request, comments on the new draft copyright and neighboring rights law. The comments took into due account the relevant provisions of the TRIPS Agreement.

India. In September 1997, a government official discussed with the Director General, the Director General Elect and other WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation.

Also in September 1997, three senior government officials held discussions with the Director General, the Director General Elect and other WIPO officials in Geneva on matters of cooperation.

Indonesia. In September 1997, two WIPO experts from Australia and the United States of America undertook a mission to the University of Indonesia in Jakarta to provide training on intellectual property law to law lecturers. The mission was funded under the project for strengthening the intellectual property system for economic and technological development, which is funded by UNDP and executed by WIPO.

Also in September 1997, two government officials held discussions with the Director General, the Director General Elect and other WIPO officials in Geneva on matters of cooperation.

Iran (Islamic Republic of). In September 1997, three government officials discussed with the Director General Elect and other WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation, in particular the implementation, by WIPO, of the UNDP-funded country project for the development of the administration, protection and effective use of intellectual property in the Islamic Republic of Iran.

Laos. In September 1997, two WIPO experts from Japan undertook a mission to the Department of Industrial Property in Vientiane to provide advice and guidance in the fields of office computerization and trademark administration, examination and registration. The mission was financed under the Japanese funds-in-trust arrangement.

Malaysia. In September 1997, two government officials discussed with the Director General and other WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation.

Also in September 1997, a government official discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva the possible organization of a second WIPO regional round table on copyright and collective management, in Kuala Lumpur, during the first half of 1998.

Mongolia. In September 1997, a government leader and another government official discussed with the Director General and other WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation.

Also in September 1997, a government official had discussions with WIPO officials in Geneva on the prospects and advantages for Mongolia of acceding to the Eurasian Patent Convention.

In late September and early October 1997, two WIPO experts from Japan undertook a mission to the Intellectual Property Office of Mongolia in Ulaanbaatar to provide advice and guidance in the fields of industrial designs, administration and registration as well as in PCT administration. The mission was financed under the Japanese funds-in-trust arrangement.

Pakistan. In September 1997, a government official met with the Director General Elect and other WIPO officials in Geneva and discussed matters of cooperation, in particular the future UNDP-funded country project for the modernization of the intellectual property system for sustainable economic development in Pakistan to be executed by WIPO.

Papua New Guinea. In September 1997, two government officials discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation.

Philippines. In September 1997, four government officials held discussions with WIPO officials in Geneva on matters of cooperation.

Samoa. In September 1997, a government official discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation, particularly trademark registry administration in his country.

Singapore. In September 1997, two government officials met with WIPO officials in Geneva and discussed matters of cooperation in training.

Also in September 1997, Miss Liew Woon Yin, Registrar of Trade Marks and Patents, Registry of Trade Marks and Patents, discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation in training in 1998.

In late September and early October 1997, two government officials undertook a study visit, funded by WIPO, to the Chinese Patent Office and the Trademark Office of the State Administration for Industry and Commerce, in Beijing.

Sri Lanka. In September 1997, a government official discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation.

Thailand. In September 1997, two government officials held discussions with WIPO officials in Geneva on present and future cooperation activities.

The mission was carried out under the UNDP-funded regional project for the modernization of the intellectual property system which is executed by WIPO.

Also in September 1997, two WIPO experts from Japan undertook a mission to the National Office of Industrial Property in Hanoi to provide advice and guidance in the fields of office computerization and industrial design administration and registration. The mission was financed under the Japanese fundsin-trust arrangement.

Also in September 1997, two government officials discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva matters of cooperation in training.

Still in September 1997, a government official discussed with WIPO officials the possible accession of his country to the Berne Convention for the Protection of Literary and Artistic Works, the holding of a national seminar on copyright and neighboring rights in Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City in 1998, and the setting up of a collective administration society in Viet Nam.

Asia and the Pacific Region. In September 1997, a WIPO consultant in computerization from Australia discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva the implementation of computerization projects and related activities that may be implemented in that region.

### **Training Courses, Seminars and Meetings**

WIPO National Seminar on Copyright for Music Publishers (Colombia). From September 1 to 3, 1997, WIPO organized that Seminar in Paipa in cooperation with the Government of Colombia. The Seminar was attended by 65 participants, among them music publishers, lawyers, authors and directors of the Society of Authors and Composers of Colombia. There were also music publishers from Argentina, Chile, Costa Rica, Peru and Venezuela. Presentations were made by three WIPO consultants from Brazil, Chile and Switzerland, six local speakers, a representative of the International Confederation of Societies of Authors and Composers for Latin America, two representatives of the LatinAmerican Federation of Music Publishers from Argentina, and a WIPO official. The Seminar also dealt with the TRIPS Agreement.

WIPO National Seminar on the International Legal Framework for the Protection of Industrial Property. The Paris Convention and the TRIPS Agreement (Ecuador). On September 17 and 18, 1997, WIPO organized that Seminar in Quito in cooperation with the Government of Ecuador. The Seminar was attended by around 150 participants, who were mainly representatives of law firms, local entrepreneurs and government officials. Presentations were made by three WIPO consultants from Chile, Colombia and Peru, four local speakers, and a WIPO official. The Seminar was aimed at providing information on the main provisions, in the industrial property field, included in the above treaties.

WIPO Seminar on the Legal Protection of Inventions and Industrial Designs for the Countries of the Central American Isthmus (Guatemala). From September 17 to 19, 1997, WIPO organized that Seminar in Guatemala City in cooperation with the Government of Guatemala. The Seminar was attended by 15 participants from Costa Rica, El Salvador, Honduras, Nicaragua and Panama, and by over 70 local participants. Presentations were made by four WIPO consultants from Costa Rica, Mexico, Spain and Venezuela, and two WIPO officials. The Seminar was aimed at providing information on the recent trends in the field of legal protection of inventions and industrial designs, as well as at promoting and disseminating the new legal provisions contained in the draft Central American Convention of Inventions and Industrial Designs.

### WIPO Permanent Committee for Development Cooperation Related to Copyright and Neighboring Rights

Twelfth Session (Geneva, September 9 to 12, 1997)

Seventy-five States, members of the Permanent Committee, were represented at the session: Algeria, Angola, Argentina, Bangladesh, Belgium, Benin, Bhutan, Bolivia, Brazil, Burkina Faso, Central African Republic, Chad, Chile, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, Côte d'Ivoire, Croatia, Cuba, Ecuador, Egypt, El Salvador, France, Gambia, Ghana, Guatemala, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Haiti, Honduras, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Kenya, Latvia, Lesotho, Malawi, Mali, Mexico, Mongolia, Morocco, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Panama, Paraguay, Philippines, Portugal, Republic of Korea, Russian Federation, Senegal, South Africa, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Sweden,

Switzerland, Thailand, Togo, Trinidad and Tobago, Uganda, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, United Republic of Tanzania, United States of America, Uruguay, Venezuela, Viet Nam, Zambia, Zimbabwe.

The following six States were represented as observers: Belarus, Kyrgyzstan, Madagascar, Qatar, Slovakia, Yugoslavia.

Observers from two intergovernmental organizations, namely: UNESCO and the WTO, and seven national and international non-governmental organizations, namely: the International Confederation of Societies of Authors and Composers (CISAC), the European Bureau of Library, Information and Documentation Associations (EBLIDA), the Ibero-Latin-American Federation of Performers (FILAIE), the International Federation of Musicians (FIM), the International Federation of Reproduction Rights Organizations (IFRRO), the Max Planck Institute for Foreign and International Patent, Copyright and Competition Law (MPI), and the University of Alicante, also participated in the meeting.

The meeting was opened by a WIPO official on behalf of the Director General of WIPO. He welcomed Bolivia and Ecuador which had become members of the Permanent Committee at the present session, bringing its membership up to 111 States. The Permanent Committee unanimously elected Mr. Fernando Zapata López (Colombia) as Chairman, and Mr. Henry Olsson (Sweden) and Mrs. Ketrah Tukuratiire (Uganda) as Vice-Chairmen.

Discussions were based on documents AB/XXIX/2, AB/XXXI/4, AB/XXXI/5 and CP/DA/XII/3 Rev., which covered development cooperation activities in the field of copyright and neighboring rights in 1995, 1996, the first half of 1997, and a summary of the activities from 1987 to 1996 respectively. The representative of the International Bureau underlined the main objectives of the WIPO Permanent Program for Development Cooperation Related to Copyright and Neighboring Rights, which concern activities in the field of development of human resources, improvement of national and regional legislation and its enforcement as well as institution building in developing countries.

He reported that the period since the last session of the Permanent Committee in 1994 had seen a remarkable increase in cooperation activities for developing countries in the field of copyright and neighboring rights, as demands from developing countries for legal and technical assistance from WIPO had grown tremendously, especially following the adoption of the TRIPS Agreement. The International Bureau had responded appropriately to the large variety of requests for assistance in the areas of developing human resources, strengthening legal infrastructure and collective management and promoting awareness of copyright and neighboring rights in developing countries.

Delegations of 50 countries and observers of one intergovernmental organization and three international non-governmental organizations participated in the discussions.

Many delegations which spoke praised the high quality of the documents prepared by the International Bureau for the meeting, and the concise and useful information they contained. Nevertheless, some delegations said that they would like to see documents containing additional information on the resources allocated to each activity, which would make possible a more complete evaluation of the development cooperation activities. A number of delegations suggested that the documents contain more analytic evaluation of the activities.

All the delegations that took the floor expressed their appreciation for, and indicated their full support of, WIPO cooperation activities in the field of copyright and neighboring rights in developing countries, covering development of human resources, development and enforcement of national and regional legislation, and institution building. They noted with satisfaction the increase of activities undertaken by the International Bureau in the last 10 years and praised the work done by the staff of the copyright development cooperation sector.

The Permanent Committee emphasized the need for WIPO to continue strengthening its cooperation with and assistance to developing countries, in particular to address the challenges to the protection of copyright and neighboring rights posed by digital technologies at the dawn of a new century, and the protection of folklore.

A number of delegations from developing countries underlined the importance of expanding activities in relation to the TRIPS Agreement, especially the preparations they have to make in the transitional period for the fulfillment of the obligations under the said Agreement including the enforcement of copyright and neighboring rights.

A number of delegations expressed their thanks to the countries and organizations that had contributed to the WIPO development cooperation program by hosting training courses or receiving trainees in the field of copyright and neighboring rights, and hoped that such contributions would continue in the years to come.

Several delegations confirmed their willingness to continue cooperating with WIPO in organizing training courses for and receiving trainees from developing countries, which would help the dissemination of information concerning copyright and neighboring rights.

Several delegations stressed the importance of continuing dialogue between developing countries and developed countries, and dialogue between receiving countries and donor countries, which would help in better designing the development cooperation program to meet the specific need of developing countries.

In conclusion, the Chairman recalled the tremendous changes that have taken place since the 80s in the field of copyright and neighboring rights, and underlined the important role the Permanent Committee of WIPO has played in fostering and strengthening the copyright protection system in developing countries. He stated that the International Bureau of WIPO has reacted fully to the requests of developing countries and hoped that it will continue to do so in the future. He further stated that the meeting provided a forum for developing countries to express views on WIPO activities and exchange information of mutual concern. He congratulated the International Bureau on its achievements in organizing training courses and providing technical assistance on legislation in developing countries, and in the meantime, hoped that future emphasis will be placed on assessment and evaluation of activities, as requested by several delegations.

The Chairman requested the International Bureau to take due note of the appeal of several delegations that WIPO break from its conventional role of acting only upon request, and try to intervene in countries where international obligations were not fulfilled and copyright was not properly respected. Referring to the TRIPS Agreement, he highlighted the com-

mitment of developing countries to comply with its requirements, and stressed the urgency of getting the necessary infrastructure in place for its implementation in developing countries by the year 2000. While referring to globalization and the emergence of the information society, he envisaged that more changes will take place in the area of copyright and neighboring rights, and was encouraged that the International Bureau is showing serious concern to these new issues.

Symposium on the WIPO Copyright Treaty (WCT) (1996) and the WIPO Performances and Phonograms Treaty (WPPT) (1996). As decided at its eleventh session (May 1994), the Permanent Committee devoted part of its twelfth session (the second day) to a Symposium on the WCT and the WPPT. Presentations were made by WIPO officials.

The presentations were followed by discussion and exchange of views among the participants and the speakers.

WIPO Introductory Seminar on Industrial Property (Geneva). In September 1997, 115 participants attended that Seminar organized by WIPO in Geneva. The participants came from Argentina, Bangladesh, Benin, Bolivia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Botswana, Brazil, Brunei Darussalam, Cape Verde, Chad, Chile, China, Costa Rica, Côte d'Ivoire, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, Fiji, Gabon, Ghana, Guatemala, Guinea, Haiti, India, Indonesia, Jordan, Kenya, Kuwait, Lesotho, Libya, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Malta. Mauritania, Mexico, Morocco, Namibia, Nepal, Nicaragua, the Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Panama, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Peru, the Philippines, Samoa, Saudi Arabia, Senegal, Sri Lanka, the Sudan, Swaziland, Syria, Thailand, Togo, Trinidad and Tobago, Uganda, the United Republic of Tanzania, Uruguay, Venezuela, Viet Nam, Yemen, Zambia, Zimbabwe, the Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN), the Subregional Multisectoral Institute for Applied Technology and Project Planning and Evaluation (ISTA), and OAPI. Presentations were made by 17 WIPO officials. The Seminar also dealt with the TRIPS Agreement.

WIPO Training Course on the Legal, Administrative and Economic Aspects of Industrial Property (Madrid). In September 1997, 15 participants attended that Course organized by WIPO and the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office in Madrid. The participants came from Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Mexico, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Uruguay and Venezuela. The travel and part of the subsistence costs were funded by the government of Spain. Presentations were made by officials of the said Office and two WIPO officials. The Course also dealt with the TRIPS Agreement.

WIPO Training Course on Industrial Property (Munich). In September 1997, seven participants attended that Course organized by WIPO in cooperation with the German Patent Office in Munich. The participants came from Egypt, Libya, Malawi, Sri Lanka, Swaziland and Trinidad and Tobago. The travel and part of the subsistence costs were funded by the Carl Duisberg Gesellschaft (CDF) and UNDP. Presentations were made by officials of the German Patent Office and a WIPO official. The Course also dealt with the TRIPS Agreement.

WIPO Training Course on Patent Documentation, Searching and Examination Techniques (Stockholm). In September and October 1997, nine participants attended that Course organized by WIPO and the Swedish Patent and Registration Office in Stockholm. The participants came from Botswana, Brazil, Chile, China, Egypt, India, Kenya, Malawi and Pakistan. The subsistence costs were funded by Sweden. Presentations were made by officials of the Swedish Office and a WIPO official.

WIPO Training Course on the Legal, Administrative and Economic Aspects of Industrial Property (Strasbourg). In September 1997, 28 participants attended that Course organized by WIPO in Strasbourg in cooperation with the Centre for International Industrial Property Studies (CEIPI) and the Governments of France and Switzerland. The participants came from Benin, Brunei Darussal-Cuba. Ghana. Guinea. Haiti, Indonesia. Lesotho, Madagascar, Mali, Mauritania, Morocco, Nicaragua, the Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Peru, the Philippines, the Sudan, Togo, Trinidad and Tobago, the United Republic of Tanzania, Uruguay, Yemen, ASEAN and OAPI. The Course was followed, for the majority of participants, by practical training in the industrial property office of one of the following countries: Bulgaria, Canada, Czech Republic, Finland, France, Hungary, Israel, Slovenia, South Africa. Presentations were made by officials of CEIPI and nine WIPO officials. The Course also dealt with the TRIPS Agreement.

WIPO/Netherlands Training Course on the Legal and Administrative Aspects of Trademarks (The Hague). In September 1997, 22 participants attended that Course organized by WIPO and BBM in The Hague. The participants came from Bangladesh, China, Egypt, Ethiopia, Fiji, India, Jordan, Kenya, Malta, Namibia, Nepal, Peru, Samoa, Sri Lanka, the Sudan, Syria, Trinidad and Tobago, Uganda, Yemen, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Presentations were made by BBM officials and four WIPO official. The subsistence costs of the participants were funded by BBM. The Course also dealt with the TRIPS Agreement.

WIPO Training Course on Practical Aspects of Patent Information (The Hague). In September 1997, 10 participants attended that Course organized by WIPO in cooperation with the Netherlands Industrial Property Office in The Hague. The participants came from Argentina, Botswana, Brazil, China, Cuba, Egypt, Kenya, Nepal, the Philippines and Saudi Arabia. Part of the subsistence allowances of the participants were funded by the Government of the Netherlands. Presentations were made by officials of the said Office and a WIPO official.

WIPO/Austria Training Course on Patent Documentation and Information (Vienna). In September 1997, six participants attended that Course organized by WIPO in cooperation with the Austrian Patent Office in Vienna. The participants came from Argentina, Cuba, Indonesia, the Philippines, Thailand and Zimbabwe. Half of the travel and subsistence costs were borne by the Government of Austria. Presentations were made by officials of the said Office and two WIPO officials.

WIPO Training Seminar on Patents, a Source of Information: Introduction to Industrial Property (The Hague). In September 1997, 24 participants attended that Seminar organized by WIPO in cooperation with the EPO in The Hague. The participants came from Argentina, Cape Verde, Chad, Costa Rica, Côte d'Ivoire, Gabon, Ghana, Jordan, Kuwait, Madagascar, Mali, Mexico, Morocco, Namibia, the Niger, Pakistan, Senegal, Sri Lanka, Togo, Viet Nam, Zimbabwe, ISTA and OAPI. Presentations were made by EPO officials and two WIPO officials. The subsistence costs of the participants were partly funded by the EPO.

### WIPO Medals

In September 1997, in the framework of the joint WIPO/Chinese Patent Office (CPO) special awards, 15 WIPO/CPO medals for outstanding inventions were awarded on the occasion of the 1997 Chinese Fifth Gold Medals Granting Ceremony.

Also in September 1997, three WIPO medals were presented to the winners of the best invention, best woman inventor and best young inventor, on the occasion of the Chinese National Exhibition of Inventions, held in Guangzhou.

# Activities of WIPO Specially Designed for Countries in Transition to Market Economy

### **Regional Activities**

Eurasian Patent Organization (EAPO). In September 1997, Mr. Viktor I. Blinnikov, President of EAPO, had discussions with the Director General and other WIPO officials in Geneva concerning the activities of that Organization and the Eurasian-PCT procedures.

WIPO-EPO Regional Seminar on Enforcement of Patent and Trademark Rights for Judges and Officials in the Custom and Police Administrations (Kazakhstan). From September 17 to 19, 1997, that Seminar was organized in Almaty by the National Patent Office of Kazakhstan in cooperation with WIPO and the EPO. It was attended by about 80 participants from 12 countries, namely: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Republic of Moldova, Russian Federation, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, Uzbekistan. They

were mainly government officials, judges, police and customs officials, patent attorneys and representatives of enterprises. Presentations were made by a government official from Kazakhstan, four WIPO consultants from the Netherlands, the United Kingdom, the United States of America and the World Customs Organization (WCO), and a WIPO official. During the Seminar the participants reported on the current situation of enforcement of industrial property rights in their respective countries. The Seminar also dealt with the TRIPS Agreement.

### **National Activities**

Albania. In September 1997, Mr. Albert Kushti, Director, Patent Office of Albania, discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva the implementation of the extension of the UNDP-financed country project aimed at strengthening the functions of the said Office.

Belarus. In September 1997, Mr. Valery Ivanovich Kudashov, Chairman, State Patent Office, and another government official had discussions with the Director General and other WIPO officials in Geneva on further cooperation between Belarus and WIPO, including a seminar on the commercialization of inventions to be held in Minsk in 1998.

Bosnia and Herzegovina. In September 1997, Mr. Ismet Galijašević, Director, Institute for Standardization, Metrology and Patents of Bosnia and Herzegovina, and another government official discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva possible cooperation with WIPO, inter alia, in organizing a seminar in Sarajevo in the first half of 1998.

Croatia. In September 1997, Mr. Nikola Kopčić, Director, State Intellectual Property Office of the Republic of Croatia, and another government official discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva possible cooperation with WIPO in organizing a seminar on patent offices in transition countries, proposed to be held in Dubrovnik in 1998.

Georgia. In September 1997, Mr. David Gabunia, Chairman, Georgian Patent Office, discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva the prospects and advantages for Georgia of acceding to the Eurasian Patent Convention, as well as organizational matters concerning a WIPO seminar on the use of modern technical means of patent information to be held in Georgia in the first half of 1998.

Also in September 1997, two WIPO officials undertook a mission to Tbilisi, at the invitation of the government authorities, to advise the Working Group of the Committee of Education, Science and Culture, Parliament of Georgia, on the draft copyright law. The advices took into due account the relevant provisions of the TRIPS Agreement.

Hungary. In September 1997, a WIPO official had discussions with officials of the Hungarian Inventors' Association, in Budapest, with regard to the

WIPO/International Association of Inventors' Associations (IFIA) International Symposium for Inventors to be held in Budapest in 1998.

Kazakhstan. In September 1997, on the occasion of the Regional Seminar referred to above, three WIPO officials visited the National Patent Office of Kazakhstan in Almaty, and had discussions with senior officials on the activities of the said Office, recent developments in national intellectual property legislation, and further cooperation with WIPO.

Republic of Moldova. In September 1997, Mr. Eugen M. Stashkov, Director General, State Agency on Industrial Property Protection, met with WIPO officials in Geneva to discuss questions concerning a possible UNDP-financed country project.

Russian Federation. In September 1997, Mr. Alexander D. Korchaguine, Director General, Russian Agency for Patents and Trademarks (ROSPATENT), and another government official had discussions with the Director General Elect and other WIPO officials in Geneva on matters of mutual interest.

Also in September 1997, the International Bureau prepared and sent to the government authorities, at their request, an opinion on the draft Part Three (Intellectual Property) of the Civil Code of the Russian Federation.

Ukraine. In September 1997, Mr. Valery L. Petrov, Chairman, State Patent Office of Ukraine, had discussions with the Director General Elect and other WIPO officials in Geneva on the prospects and advantages for Ukraine of acceding to the Eurasian Patent Convention.

Uzbekistan. In September 1997, Mr. Akil A. Azimov, Director, State Patent Office of the Republic of Uzbekistan, discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva the prospects and advantages for Uzbekistan of acceding to the Eurasian Patent Convention.



### **National Contacts**

Andorra. In September 1997, WIPO prepared and transmitted to the government authorities, at their request, comments on the draft patent law. This draft law took into due account the relevant provisions of the TRIPS Agreement.

Also in September 1997, two government officials discussed with WIPO officials in Geneva certain provisions prepared by WIPO, in particular PCT-related, for inclusion in the above-mentioned draft law.

Denmark. In September 1997, 30 managers of a large Danish telecommunications operator visited WIPO and were briefed on WIPO's activities and intellectual property in general.

Switzerland. In September 1997, a WIPO official participated as a speaker in a conference on trademark management organized in Geneva by a Geneva-based German firm of trademark consultants.

United States of America. In September 1997, Mr. Bruce A. Japan Intellectual Property Association (JIPA). 
